THE COVER

Collection of Mr. Milton Greenebaum

The Greenebaum collection is unquestionably one of the most comprehensive ever formed and presents probably the widest variety ever offered at auction. There are not only cancellations of the varied types of Masonic insignia but they are presented from an exceptionally wide range of towns, large and small. There are a great many original covers which prove the use of the varied types of Masonic insignia from particular towns. Bro. Greenebaum was constantly making an endeavor to find bold, clear strikes of the cancellations. Unfortunately the Post Office clerks did not always strike their cancellers the way we would like to have them, nevertheless the array of bold, clear strikes in the collection adds greatly to its interest and beauty. Cancellations of the various types of Masonic and Fraternal Insignia were used at a number of towns in the 1851-1880 period, when Postmasters provided their own cancelling devices and it is surprising what a wide variety of Masonic cancellations it is possible to obtain.

Bro. Greenebaum developed a chart to classify the many types and characteristics of Masonic cancellations. We reproduce this chart and have based our descriptions on the types shown in the chart. Since each type has been assigned a distinct classification the chart should prove useful for the future.

"HARD CURRENCY"

During World War I, certain stamps in Europe began to be treated as "hard currency." To have a perfect standard of value, these stamps had to be mint, because canceled copies vary too greatly in price. Furthermore, each copy had to be never hinged, because all had to be the same, exactly as two "blocks of gold."

Before and during World War II, this practice spread far more extensively in Europe. A pack of cigarettes or a pound of coffee had their respective "investment value." But for the sophisticated investors mint n.h. stamps in top condition became one of the best substitutes for gold, because hoarding this metal was punishable by death in Occupied Europe. Issues like the Belgian Helmet, the Austrian 1908 and 1910 Jubilees, the 1936 WIPA sheet, the Dollfuss and the Orphan semipostals of France were the speculators favorite. Also, the United States Columbians and Trans-Mississippis in top mint conditon n.h. were sought after, not by philatelists but by speculators, who preferred these "gold" stamps to the valueless paper currency in many European countries.

What happened was that this practice after World War II spread to philately, when some European collectors and dealers only would buy a mint stamp without the slighted trace of a hinge or hinge mark. The idea took hold and then spread all over the philatelic world.

What can we do about it? As you wrote, "very little." It seems to me that business has become too much of a part of this fine hobby of philately. Too many stamp dealers are more interested in profits than in philately. But far too many collectors also are more interested in making money with stamps rather than deriving pleasure by collecting them.

MASONIC CACHETS

WILL ROGERS, MASON

Bro. Rogers was born near Claremore Okla (Indian Territory at the time) on Nov. 4, 1879. He was the son of Clem V. and Mary Rogers, both part Chero-kee Indian. What schooling he had was at Kemper Academy, Booneville, Mo. which he attended for part of two terms. In 1905 he entered vaudville at Keith's Union Square Theatre, New York City, delivering humorous monologues while doing lasso tricks. As a lecturer, motion picture actor, and newspaper columnist, he was known for his shrewd but kindly commentary on current events. He was nearly always referred to as this national professional profe tion's unofficial ambassador to any foreign country he visited, and was always well received by those nations. He was married to Betty Blake in Nov. 1908 and to this union three children were born. Will Rogers was killed Aug. 15, 1935 in an airplane crash at Port Barrow, Alaska, while flying with his friend Wiley Post, holder of the round the world flight record.

Noble Rogers was raised March 21, 1906 in Claremore Lodge No. 53, Claremore, Okla. He was also a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, Valley of Claremore, Okla., and Akdar Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S., at Tulsa, Okla. —R. L. Needham
