



The two Canadian postage stamps illustrated show an urban church (CDN No. 1004), and a rural church (CDN No. 1006). These stamps represent churches of all denominations and bring to mind our Brothers who have helped to further the great cause of religion throughout the world.

The following is a list of our *Brothers of the Cloth*. While the list is certainly not all-inclusive, it is representative of such distinguished brethren who have passed our way. In some cases, certain postage stamps other than those illustrated above are more directly applicable to the brother listed. In these cases, an appropriate notation is shown for these brethren. United States and Canadian stamps related to religion are: Religious Freedom: USA No. 1099; Jewish: USA No. 2017; Roman Catholic: CDN No. 1029; Anglican: CDN No. 1226; Mennonite: CDN No. 643; Salvation Army: CDN No. 954; World Council of Churches: CDN No. 994; Methodist and United Church: CDN No. 662; Presbyterian: CDN No. 663.

NOTE: Your author is presently completing a detailed work under the title Brothers of the Cloth that includes a short biography on all subjects together will complete Masonic information. This list shows only the subject's original blue lodge. In many cases, this information is not known, but the subject was definitely a Mason. Most of the brethren shown had highly distinguished professional careers and many were very active in their lodge, their grand lodge and other Masonic bodies (Royal Arch, A.A.S.R., Knights Templar and the Shrine). Membership in these other bodies was often used to confirm that the subject was a Mason in lieu of information on their blue lodge.

Adams, Myron E. (1876-1930); Social worker and Baptist minister; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Aglipay, Gregoria (?); Chaplain General of the Philippine Army; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Aikens, Charles T. (1862-1927); University president and Lutheran minister; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Alberti, Manuel Masimino (1763-1811); Catholic priest and Argentine patriot; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Anderson, Edward (1833-1916); Congregational clergyman; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Anderson, William F. (1860-1944); Methodist Episcopal Bishop; Mason no details on blue lodge.

Anderson, William H. (1874 - ?); Prohibitionist; founded the American Christian Alliance; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Andre, Christopher Karl (?): Austrian cleric; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Andrews, Robert (?); Revolutionary chaplain; Williamsburg Lodge, Virginia.

Ashley, Edward (1854-1931); Episcopalian Clergyman, Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Axton, John Thomas (1870 - ?); Chief of Chaplains, United States Army; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Bader, Jesse M. (1886 - ?); Church of Christ pastor; Washington Lodge No. 5, Atchison, Kansas.

Baker, James C. (1879 - ?); Methodist Bishop; McLean Lodge No. 469, McLean, Illinois.

Ballou, Hosea (1771-1852); Baptist clergyman; Warren Lodge No. 23, Woodstock, Vernont.

Bans, Jose (?); Catholic friar; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Baron, Joseph L. (1894 - ?); Jewish rabbi; Wisconsin Lodge No. 13, Milwaukee; (Additional stamp: USA No. 2017).

Bartlett, Frederick B. (1882-1941); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Bass, Edward (1726-183); Protestant Episcopal bishop; St. John's Lodge No. 1, Portsmouth, New Hampshire.

Baxter, Bruce R. (1892-1947); Methodist Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge. Baylor, Robert E.B. (1793-1874); Baptist Clergyman, Baylor Lodge No. 125, Gay Hill, Washington County, Texas.

Beardsley, John (1732-1803); Clergyman; Mason, no details on blue lodge, (founder of Freemasonry in New Brunswick, Canada).

Beatty, Troy (1866-1922); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Beekman, Frederick W. (1871 - ?); Protestant and Episcopal clergyman; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Bellany, Francis J. (1855-1931); Baptist minister; Little Falls Lodge No. 181, Little Falls, New York. (Additional stamp: USA No. 1596)

Bellerman, Johann Joachim (1754-1842); German theologian; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Benedict, David (1779-1874); Baptist minister and author; Newport Lodge No. 1, Newport Rhode Island.

Berman, Morton M. (1899 - ?); Jewish rabbi; Mason, no details on blue lodge. (Additional stamp: USA 2017).

Birkhead, Leon M. (1885 - ?); Clergyman and author, Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Blake, Edgar (1869-1943); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Blankingship, Alexander H. (1894 - ?); Episcopal Bishop; Alexandria-Washington Lodge No. 22, Alexandria, Virginia.

Boaz, Hiram Abiff (1866 - ?); Methodist bishop; Granger Lodge No. 677, Granger, Texas.

Booth, Ballington (1859-1940); Reformer and founder of The Volunteers of America; Montclair Lodge No. 144, Montclair, New Jersey. (Additional stamp: USA No. 2039)

Booth, Charles B. (1887 - ?); Reformer and welfare worker; Montclair Lodge No. 144, Montclair, New Jersey.

Bowen, John Westley Edward (1889 - ?); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Bradley, Preston (1888 - ?); Protestant minister and author; Blaney Lodge No. 271, Chicago, Illinois.

Brannan, Samuel (1819-1889); Mormon Church elder; California Lodge No. 1, San Francisco, California. (Additional stamp: USA No. 950)

Brashares, Charles W. (1891 - ?); Methodist bishop; Harmony Lodge No. 38, Gorham, Maine.

Brasted, Alva J. (1876 - ?); Baptist minister; Wauconda Lodge No. 298, Wauconda, Illinois.

Breckinridge, Robert Jefferson (1800-1871); Presbyterian clergyman; Lexington Lodge No. 1, Lexington, Kentucky.

Brinker, Howard R. (1893 - ?); Episcopal bishop; Ashlar Lodge No. 10, Douglas Wyoming.

Brown, Wallace E. (1868-1939); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Brown, William A. (1878 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Brownell, Thomas C. (1779-1865); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Adelphi Lodge No. 63, New Haven, Connecticut.

Budlong, Frederick G. (1881-1953); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Bulkley, William F. (1881-?); Protestant Episcopal Archdeacon; Wasatch Lodge No. 1, Salt Lake City, Utah.

Cabaniss, James Allen (1911 -); Presbyterian minister and author; Hazelhurst Lodge No. 25, Hazelhurst, Mississippi.

Cadman, S. Parkes (1864-1936); Congregational Church clergyman; Royal Arch Lodge No. 2, New York City, New York.

Calvo, Francisco (1820-1890); Catholic Jesuit priest; established Freemasonry in Costa Rica (1865) with charter for Caridad Lodge No. 26.

Canham, Erwin D. (1904 - ?); editor of the Christian Science Monitor at Aubum, Maine and head of the Washington Bureau, 1932-39; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Capers, William T. (1867-1943); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Carles, Antoine (? - 1824); French Roman Catholic priest; associated with John Paul Jones and Benjamin Franklin who were both Freemasons; L'Esperance Lodge, Savannah, Georgia.

Carson, Harry R. (1869-1948); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Casady, Thomas (1881 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details

Castilla, Francisco Pio Pacheco (1826-1896); Roman Catholic priest, Esperanza Lodge No. 2, Costa Rica.

Channing, George (1888 - ?); editor of the Christian Science Journal, Sentinel and Herald; first reader, mother church, Boston, Massachusetts; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Chase, Carlton (1794-1870); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Chase, Philander (1775-1852); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Temple Lodge No. 14, Albany, New York.

Cherrington, Ernest H. (1877-1950); Temperance leader; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Chicheley, Henry (c. 1362-1443); Archbishop of Canterbury; played a leading part in many ecclesiastical and political negotiations; gave permission for a lodge to he held in the year 1429 at Canterbury under his patronage; tradition states he was grand master of English Masons until 1443.

Chivington, John M. (? - 1895); Methodist minister and missionary; Wyandotte Lodge No. 3, Kansas City, Kansas.

Clair, Matthew W. (1865-1943); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Clingman, Charles (1883 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Fort Thomas Lodge No. 808, Fort Thomas, Kentucky.

Clippinger, Arthur R. (1878-1958); Evangelical United Brethren Church bishop; Miami Valley Lodge, No. 660, Dayton, Ohio.

Coleman, Leighton (1837-?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Cordier, Abbe (?) French Catholic clergyman; Lodge of Nine Sisters, Paris France; along with Benjamin Franklin, supported Francois Marie Arouet de Voltaire during his initiation into this lodge.

Corson, Fred P. (1896 - ?); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Costilla, Miguel Hidalgo y (1753-1811); Catholic priest; led the first revolt against the Spaniards in Mexico which started the Mexican revolution; Arquitechtura Moral Lodge, Mexico City, Mexico.

Crick, Douglas Henry (?); English Anglican bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Crotty, Horace (1886-1951); English Anglican bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Dagwell, Benjamin D. (1890 - ?); Episcopal bishop; Caesarea Lodge No. 64, Keyport, New Jersey.

Darlington, James H. (1856-1930); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Darst, Thomas (1875-1948); Episcopal Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Davenport, George W. (1870 - ?); Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Decell, John L. (1877-1945); Methodist Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Deloria, Philip (1854-1931); Sioux Indian Chief and Episcopal priest; Jefferson Lodge No. 104, New Albany, Indiana.

Dobbs, Hoyt (1878-1954); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Dodd, William (1729-1777); Anglican priest; chaplain to King George III; St. Alban's Lodge No. 29, London, England.

Dow, Lorenzo (1777-1834); Methodist minister; St. Albans Lodge, Bristol, Rhode Island.

Dunkelberger, Harold Aberly (?); Lutheran minister; Eureka Lodge No. 302, Mechanicsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Easterbrook, Edmund P. (1865-1933); Methodist minister, Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Edsell, Samuel C. (1860-1917); Episcopal bishop; Minneapolis Lodge No. 19, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Entick, John (1703-1773); Anglican clergyman and schoolmaster; chiefly remembered in Freemasonry for his edition of the *Book of Constitutions* (1756); Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Evans, Hugh I. (1887-1958); Presbyterian minister; Palestine Lodge No. 158, Marysville, Ohio.

Eversull, Harry K. (1893-1953); Congregational minister and later Presbyterian minister; Gothic Lodge No. 582, East St. Louis, Illinois.

Exo, Arnold H. (?); Christian Science Church official; First reader of the First Church of Christ Scientist, Boston; Massachusetts; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Ferris, David L. (1864-1947); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Hailman Lodge No. 321, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Finlay, George (1877-1938); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Fisher, Geoffrey F. (1887 - ?) Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury; Old Reptionian Lodge No. 3725, London, England.

Fleck, John Gabriel (1891 - ?); Lutheran minister; Good Samaritan Lodge No. 336, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

Flint, Charles W. (1878 - ?)' Methodist Bishop; Mt. Vernon Lodge No. 112, Mt. Vernon, Iowa.

Foreman, Lawton Durant (?); Baptist Clergyman, teacher, author; doctor in Bible languages; Adoniram Lodge No. 288, Mabelvale, Arkansas.

Fowler, Charles H. (1837-1908); Methodist Episcopal bishop; Vitruvius Lodge No. 81, Wheeling, Illinois.

Fox, George L. (1900-1943); Methodist minister; one of the "Four Immortal Chaplains"; Vermont; Moose River Lodge No. 82, Concord, Vermont. (Additional stamp: USA No. 956)

Fox, Herbert H. H. (1871-1943); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Ashlar Lodge No. 29, Billings Montana.

Frank, Eugene M. (1907 - ?); Methodist Bishop; Wyandotte Lodge No. 3, Kansas City, Kansas.

Freeman, James E. (1866-1943); Protestant Episcopal bishop and author; Nepperhan Lodge No. 736, Yonkers, New York.

Garrett, Alexander C. (1832-1924); First Protestant Episcopal Bishop of Dallas, Texas; Dallas Lodge No. 760, Dallas, Texas.

Garth, Schuyler E. (1897-1947); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Gilbert, Levi (1852-1917) Methodist minister; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Gilbert, Mahlon N. (1848-1900); Episcopal coadjutor bishop; Tienuderrah Lodge No. 605, New York, New York.

Gill, Thomas Jeffrey (b1954); Episcopal Clergyman; Landrum Lodge No. 48, Savannah, Georgia.

Gilmore, Albert F. (? - 1943); Editor of Christian Science weekly and monthly magazines; president of The Mother Church; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Goldsmith, Joel S. (1892-1964): Christian Science lecturer and practitioner; Darcy Lodge, New York, New York.

Gooden, Reginald H. (1910 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Goodwin, Frederick D. (1888 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Graham, David C. (1884 - ?); Evangelist clergyman and author; educational missionary to China; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Gravatt, John J. (1881 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Gravatt, William L. (1858-1942); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Gray, Duncan M. (1898 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Green Thomas E. (1857 - ?); Presbyterian minister and later Protestant Episcopal priest and author; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Green, William M. (1876-1942); Protestant Episcopal bishop; King Solomon Lodge No. 333, Meridian, Mississippi.

Gribbin, Robert E. (1887 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Griswold, Alexander V. (1766-1843); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Aurora Lodge No. 35, Harwinton, Connecticut.

Guerry, William A. (1861-1928); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Made a Mason "at sight," no details on blue lodge.

Gunn, George P. (1903 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Campbell Lodge No. 316, Altavista, Virginia.

Haggard, Forest Deloss (b. 1925); Minister, Church of Christ; Ancient Form Lodge No. 34, Shawnee, Kansas.

Hall, Prince (1748-1807); Methodist minister; established the African Grand Lodge and was first Grand Master; father of African-American Freemasonry in the United States; the Prince Hall Grand Lodges in the United States are named after him; he was originally made a Freemason in a British Army lodge of Irish register that was attached to General Gage's regiment.

Halsey, Frederick (1870-1952); Cannon, Church of England; Apollo University Lodge No. 357, Oxford.

Hamilton, John W. (1845 - ?); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Hamline, Leonidas L. (1797-1865); Methodist Episcopal Bishop; Lafayette Lodge No. 79, Zanesville, Ohio.

Hammaker, Wilbur E. (1876 - ?); Methodist Bishop; Jefferson Lodge No. 90, Middeltown, Ohio.

Harris, Frederick B. (?); Methodist Episcopal minister; Pentalpha Lodge No. 34, Washington, District of Columbia.

Harris, Robert LeRoy (1874-1948); Episcopal Bishop; Sanford L. Collins Lodge No. 396, Toledo, Ohio.

Harris, Thaddeus M. (1768-1842); Unitarian Church pastor and author; King Solomon Lodge, Charlestown, Massachusetts.

Harris, William L. (1817-1887); Methodist Episcopal Bishop; Mout Zion Lodge No. 9, Mount Vernon, Ohio.

Hart, Oliver J. (1892 - ?); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Philanthropic Lodge No. 32, York, South Carolina.

Hartzell, Joseph C. (1842-1929); Methodist Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Hawkesworth, Alan S. (1867-1942); Protestant Episcopal clergyman and mathematician; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Hazen, Joseph C. (1874-?); Baptist clergyman; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Heitman, Charles E. (1874-1948); manager of the Christian Science Publishing Society and director of The Mother Church; Marble Lodge No. 702, Tuckahoe, New York.

Henderson, Howard A. M. (1836-1912); Methodist Episcopal clergyman; Hiran Lodge No. 4, Frankfort, Kentucky; H. A. M. Henderson Lodge No. 515, Bethlehem, Kentucky was named after him.

Herbert, Percy Mark (1885 - ?); Anglican bishop; Lodge of Rectitude No. 502, Rugby, England.

Hernandez, Don Manuel Diaz (1774-1863); Catholic priest and patriot; Santa Cruz de Palmas, Canary Islands; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Hill, Claude E. (1874-1957); Disciples of Christ minister and author; Chattanooga Lodge No. 199, Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Hoffmann, Frederick Herman (1917 -); Baptist clergyman; Mt. Rushmore Lodge No. 220, Rapid City, South Dakota.

Hoge, Moses D. (1819-1899: Presbyterian clergyman; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Holt, Ivan Lee (1886 - ?); Methodist bishop; Tuscan Lodge No. 360, St. Louis, Missouri.

Hopkins, John Henry (1792-1868); Protestant Episcopal Bishop and author; Ohio Lodge No. 113, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Howley, William (?); Archbishop of Canterbury; Jehosaphat Lodge, Bristol, England.

Hughes, Matthew S. (1863-1920); Methodist Episcopal bishop; Ancient Landmark Lodge No. 17, Portland, Maine.

Hunting, George C. (1871-1924); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Virginia Lodge No. 3, Virginia City, Nevada.

Huston, S. Arthur: Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Ireland, John (?); Chaplain; first chaplain to be commissioned in the United States Navy (1816); Fortitude Lodge No. 19, Brooklyn, New York.

Ivins, Benjamin F. P. (1884 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Plymouth-Kilwinning Lodge No. 149, Plymouth, Indiana.

Jarvis, Abraham (1739-1813); Protestant Episcopal bishop; St. John's Lodge No 2, Middletown, Connecticut.

Johnson, Eben S. (1866-1939); Methodist Episcopal bishop; Kane Lodge No. 377, Ida Grove, Iowa.

Jones, Robert E. (1872 - ?); Methodist bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Juhan, Frank A. (1887 - ?); Protestant Episcopal Bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

Kavanaugh, Benjamin (1805-1888); Methodist missionary; Naphtali Lodge No. 25, St. Louis, Missouri.

Kelley, Randy (1952 -); United Methodist Church minister; Gethsemane Lodge, Alabama.

Kelsey, Ridell Archibald Jr. (1917 -); United Methodist clergyman; Chaplain in the Civil Air Patrol; Compass Lodge No. 922, Illinois.

Kemerer, Benjamin T. (1874 - ?); Protestant Episcopal bishop; Mason, no details on blue lodge.

King, Paschal Alexander Jr. (1952 -); United Methodist Minister; Lancaster Lodge No. 57, Lancaster, Ohio.

King, Thomas Starr (1824-1864); Unitarian clergyman; represented in the National Hall of Fame, Washington, District of Columbia; Oriental Lodge No. 144, San Francisco, California.

Kingston, George Frederick (1889-1950); Anglican archbishop; Ionic Lodge No. 25, Toronto, Ontario.




