# Masonic Stamp Associations Around the World

Unlike other stamp collections the field of Masonic stamps is quite specialized and consequently there are relatively few stamp associations who study Masonic philately. Coupled with the fact that not all of the existing groups are listed on the Internet yet, which makes it hard to find them. The following are some of those groups that are known to me, if you are aware of other please let me know and I will included them in future newsletters.

### The United Kingdom

Brother Trevor Fray a member of St. John's Lodge #70 in Plymouth started the Masonic Philatelic Club in England in 1974. Their objectives are "The furtherance of Masonic Research via the media of postage stamps, the dissemination of knowledge gained and the quiet enjoyment of this interesting hobby." The club began publishing a newsletter in 1976 and have continues to this day.

# Mystery Stamps Identified!

As a result of re-visiting the Masonic Philatelic Club website in the UK, I noted that they had added five new Masonic Stamps issued by General Nikolai Yudenich (1882-1953) commander of the Russian Caucasus Army in 1919 during the Bolshevik Revolution. (See them depicted on page 6.)

The five stamps depict Masonic symbols and according to the web site each asks the question "Are you a Mason?" The web site stated tat there appeared to be no catalogue references to these stamps. Being kind of guy who loves a mystery I conducted my own research and discovered the stamps listed in the Scott Catalogue under the listing of "Army of the North" in the back of the Russian section. Scott lists them as issued in September 1919 Nos. 1-5 (A1-A5) with the following notation: "The letters OKCA are the initials of Russian words meaning "Special Corps, Army of the North," The stamps were in use from about the end of September to the end of December 1919."

Surprisingly the stamps do not have a high catalogue value with the 2009 suggested price of .40 cents for mint and .70 for cancelled. Thank you to our friends in the UK for bringing these rare Masonic stamps to our attention.

# Canadian Stamp of the Month

Although Canada Post has never produced a truly Masonic stamp, they released a stamp in 2001 honouring the work of the Masonic fraternal organization known as the "Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine" or simply the Shriners. Established in the USA in 1870 and known for their frivolity, red fez hats, little cars, clowns and parades has become famous for its charitable work for children in which they have established and fund 22 children's hospitals throughout North America. All the medical service delivered at a Shrine Orthopedic or Burn unit hospital to any child up to the age of 18 is completely free. Ironically many of people who are critics of Freemasonry, praise the work of the Shrine are often are unaware of the fact that all Shriners are Freemasons!

#### The USA


The George Washington Masonic Stamp Club (GWMSC) was organized in 1956 as an affiliate of the Masonic Stamp Club of New York and subsequently became an independent entity in 1960. Initially the GWMSC was comprised of members primarily in the Washington DC area but now they have over 400 members throughout the USA and around the world. The GWMSC does not produce a newsletter but they do specialize in US First Day of Issue covers of Masonic significance. Instead of annual dues they have a one-time life membership fee of \$20. ### Area Resources

The Ottawa area is blessed with a number of resources for both the Freemason and the stamp collector.

For the Freemason the Ottawa /Gatineau area has three Masonic districts comprised of 33 Lodges plus it has four Royal Arch Chapters, The Scottish Rite, two Shrine clubs, one Knight Templar, two Eastern Star Chapters and Demolay, Rainbow Girls and Jobbies for our youth.

For the collector there is Ian Kimerly's Stamp Studio, five stamp clubs, and an open stamp and coin show every month at the RA Center on Riverside Drive in Ottawa (our club member George McManus usually has a booth).

The first weekend in May of every year is the ORPEX (Ottawa Regional Philatelic Exhibition) one of Canada's largest stamp shows.

# Anti-Mason of the Month

General Francisco Franco (1892-1975) was the

military dictator and head of state that ruled from October 1936 to his death. This autocrat ruled by fear and suppression, utilizing a variety of iron fisted methods such as censorship, coercion, dissolving parliament, establishing concentration camps, forced labour camps, heavy prison



sentences along with the death penalty.

Franco's persecution of freemasons began in 1936 following a military coup, which resulted in him becoming the military commander for the Nationalist Movement. Backed by the Catholic Church, which supported a crusade to liberate Spain from "the Judeo-Masonic-Communist conspiracy dubbed the "Contubernio" Under his leadership the slightest suspicion of being a mason was reason enough to be executed by a firing squad. By 16 December 1937, According to the annual Masonic assembly held in Madrid in 1937, all of masons that had not escaped from the areas under nationalist control had been murdered.

Franco's hatred of Freemasonry was deep seated and in 1938 he decreed that all Masonic symbols be erased from every grave marker in Spain and in 1939 he banned Freemasonry and made it a criminal offence to ever have belonged to the Craft.

In 1940 he issued a decree banning Freemasonry along with other so called secret societies claiming that Freemasonry was the cause of the of both the fall of the Spanish Empire in the 19<sup>th</sup> century and the Spanish Civil War in the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Included in his eight-article decree, article No 5 stated, "From the date of this publication, mason and communists, as defined in No. 4 above, will be liable to be imprisoned with a "minor jail offense", of a minimum of 12 years and one day, but this situation could be aggravated by the "Aggravated Circumstances" as explained in Article No. 6."

Article 6 defined aggravated circumstances to be any mason who had obtained the 18<sup>th</sup> to 33<sup>rd</sup> degree or have taken part in at annual communication committee of the Board of the Grand Orient of Spain. Those convicted of aggravated circumstances were usually executed.


Franco's hatred of Freemason continued throughout his life and there are several theories as to antipathy including having been refused initiation into the Moroccan Lodge his brother Ramond Franco belonged to and having been one of two Generals who refused to join the Military Lodge "Brotherly union" in 1925. Others have suggested that being a staunch Roman Catholic he simply believed in the existence of the "Contubernio". Franco spent most of his military career surrounded by right wing clergy who promoted the restoration of church authority in concert with a military led right wing crusade against the Contubernio.

By linking Freemasons to Communists, Franco was able to convince countries like Britain, France and the USA to stay out of Spanish affairs while at the same time gain the support of Germany and Italy. The fear of Communism resulted in the murder torture and imprisonment of untold numbers of men whose only crime was to be a member of the fraternity. After the death of Franco, Freemasons in Spain regained their rights and Masonry continues to exist but not without further challenges, but that is a tale for another time.
